RESPONSE TO HAITIAN EARTHQUAKE

PARENTING INSIGHTS

Here are some of “the sweet rewards of saying yes to God” and lovingly obeying his commands.

1. The result of obedience is joy. Obeying God isn't a burden. Instead, it's uplifting to work in harmony with God rather than fight against him.
2. Obedience brings a promise of blessings. Although we don't obey just to gain God's favor, his Word promises blessings for our reverent obedience (see Deut. 11:13-15).
3. Obedience demonstrates our love. Convey to children that consequences aren't the sole point of rules. Instead, we should obey as a loving response to God, who loves us each unconditionally—and forgives us when we disobey.

Talking about and following God's commands helps children learn about obedience. Start a conversation:

1. How do rules help us? Why is it important to have rules in a family, in school, and in society?
2. What makes you want to obey God? What makes you want to obey your parents or teachers?
3. Why is it sometimes hard to obey? What helps you obey, especially when it's tempting not to?
4. What good things happen when you obey?

MAKING A DIFFERENCE AT HOGAR DE NINOS EMANUEL

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we sit down to write this report, it is exciting to re-cap in our minds all that has happened at Hogar Emanuel again this past year. We can't help but drop to our knees and thank God for His help and direction for this particular children's home and all the progress there again this past year despite all the problems.

We started out 2009 with some big worries about how we were going to keep up with the increasing demands of paying salaries due to the jump in minimum wage requirements, soaring electric bills, as well as the increase in all the other day-to-day expenses of running the home. We wondered if we could just keep status quo let alone be able to move forward with any new projects.

"Oh ye, of little faith" rings in our ears because in spite of the economy in the US, you again have answered the call to help the poor and underprivileged in Honduras, the second poorest country in the Americas.

We were able to sustain this program due to the response we received from you in so many ways, one of which is to help newborns in a society where they are a burden instead of a blessing. You will be hearing more about the Nursery Project in the coming year. However, we feel we are now even more equipped to help save lives and souls from the depravity and poverty that is now worse than ever.

Here is our year in review:

- Older youth are doing well at their own micro-enterprise at the tortilleria (making, packaging, and selling tortillas) while continuing to learn the basics of

running a business through the APORTE project.

- Kids are bringing home Honor roll grades on their report cards.
- Two more bunk rooms and another bath were prepared in the bunk house building.
- All tools and equipment are now able to be stored on newly built shelves in the much enlarged garage.
- Lauren Farrell, Brethren Volunteer Service/Global Mission Partnership volunteer, began her two years of service to the Home in April.
- All the paper work was finally completed and the 32-passenger Nissan bus arrived at the home for transporting the kids to their schools.
- Little damage was caused at the Home after Honduras experienced a rather large earthquake on the northern shores of the country.
- A ramp was constructed into the main building so we could offer refuge to a handicapped child.
- A political crisis hit the country when their president was removed from office in June. However, a new president was peacefully elected in November.
- The Nursery section of a two-story construction project has been completed making it possible for us to provide a home for resident newborn infants.
- A kidnapping victim (a friend of Hogar Emanuel) was safely returned to her family.
- "Voices with a Cause—USA" a benefit dinner/concert held at Camp Harmony in Hooversville, PA, was a huge success.

- The chicken farm is doing well.
- Five new resident children were accepted during the year.
- Eleven children were removed from the sponsorship program (either by graduating from the home or moving to a different facility)
- As of December 31, 2009, the Home was caring for seventy-six resident children at the Home with an average of eighty throughout the year.
- As of December 2009, there were twenty on-site staff members caring for the children at an average salary of \$358 per month.

The above are only the highlighted points. However, there were so many other good things (too numerous to mention here) that happened throughout this past year because of your loving and prayerful support.

El Hogar de Niños Emanuel is a home to happy and healthy children thanks to all of you. Thank you and God Bless you for your help and continued support. We have come to expect a miracle every day and have found the words of Hudson Taylor our comfort in this ministry. "Gods work done in Gods way will never lack full supply."
